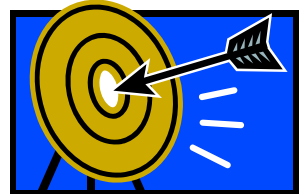

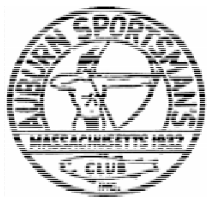

### Worcester County League - Craig Cortis

The October meeting was held 10/18/2013 at Norco Sportsmen's Club in Princeton. W.C.L. president Ron Amidon, who serves as a member of the GOAL board of directors, reported that GOAL membership is up by about 7,000 from this time last year. Ron also mentioned that finances for the organization are over 200% ahead of last year's status, which is heartening news considering the importance of GOAL to Mass. Gun owners and shooters/hunters. In other news, delegates were told that the large, polluting tire dump on the Nashua River in Bolton Flats W.M.A. that I mentioned in last month's newsletter is not being forgotten. Fisheries + Wildlife is aware of the situation and is monitoring and investigating this tire dump prior to taking action. Regarding open space and public access lands, we were told that State Senator Steve Brewer and other interested officials are in touch with W.C.L. and associated groups concerning the approximately 300-acre Fernald School Developmental Center site in the Templeton/South Royalston area. This facility has, or is in the process of being, closed. Disposition of all the acreage is a major concern; about 25 acres are now spoken for, as of 10/18. The bulk of the property could potentially be acquired F+W as additional free-access (hunting/fishing) public land, possibly a new W.M.A. Interested parties will do what they can to save this site from development and keep it open.

Some of you are aware that free copies of W.C.L. "Sportsmen's News" (issued monthly) are available in the A.S.C. lounge, kept in a special upright container at the west end of the counter dividing the main bar area from the tables. Jim Nishan, A.S.C. president and recording secretary for W.C.L., writes a monthly column on legislation in our publication. I want to call your attention to Jim's October issue article, which begins on page 8. The ammunition-availability question that constantly occupies the attentions of so many shooters now is fully and factually addressed within this article, and it's by far and away the best explanation I've yet to read concerning this worrisome problem. You can still get a copy through mid-November or later, and Sportsmen's News is available at numerous locations elsewhere. Next W.C.L. meeting will be right here at A.S.C. on 11/15/2013 at 7:30pm.
