**Worcester County League - Craig Cortis**

A front page story that appeared in the July 19 issue of the Worcester Telegram does much to illuminate the problem of illegal dumping on public lands, one of the most serious issues dealt with by the Mass. Environmental Police, Fisheries and Wildlife managers, and other administrators of public properties owned by the state. Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) are particularly susceptible to this crime, as well as the damage being done by the relentless and widespread illegal operation of off-road motor vehicles: ATVs. "4-wheelers", trail bikes, etc.

I submit the following for the benefit of the new and recent A.S.C. members who might not be familiar with the W.C.L. The origin of the Worcester County League of Sportsmen's Clubs (officially incorporated as an organization in 1921) dates back to the 1800s. A club in Fitchburg was the nexus for growing concerns among outdoors people regarding the conservation of open spaces, the use of lands in general, and wise, conservative management of fish and wildlife species for the benefit of future generations. Those far-sighted sports men and women were the genesis for what would become the W.C.L., a county organization which is the largest of several County Leagues in Massachusetts. W.C.L. represents over fifty member clubs in Worcester County, including some in neighboring counties. In total, many thousands of individuals are thus represented. The various clubs involved include those termed as fish and game, rod and gun, sportsmen's, rifle and pistol, surfcasters, other fishing associations, hunting dog groups, and so on. W.C.L. meets monthly on the third Friday of each month, except for July and August. We do not meet at a central headquarters. Instead, different member clubs serve as hosts for League meetings throughout our September – June schedule. This means that meeting locations change each month. Only one delegate from each club in attendance may vote on League business, although additional members from a given club are welcome to attend, as well as interested members of the general public.
