Worcester County League - Craig Cortis

The October meeting was held 10/15/10 at NORCO Sportsman's Club, Princeton. This club, like many others in Central Mass., was formed in the 1930s and has a fine group of people dedicated to keeping old traditions alive and well. Originally created for Norton Company employees and retirees, the club changed its membership requirements back in 1991 so that non-Norton people could become members. MassWildlife Central District Manager Bill Davis spoke at length about pheasant stocking policies, particularly in response to a letter sent to MassWildlife by the League's corresponding secretary, John O'Leary of Leicester Rod and Gun. (John's letter concerned stocking practices at Quaboag WMA; Bill Davis explained how such policies are determined and implemented according to a variety of factors.) Central District Land Agent Brandon Kibbe gave a detailed report about choices landowners can make regarding protection of open space properties so that they can remain free of development into the future and also be assured of staying open to public access for hunting, fishing, and other outdoors activities, minus off-road vehicle use. The W.C.L. is considering some kind of future protection arrangement for our 100-acre parcel in New Braintree adjacent to Winimusset WMA.

On the Mass. Legislative front, I need to reiterate something I've mentioned in recent issues of the newsletter. Although Gov. Patrick's complex and harmful gun control bill, H.4102, did not advance out of the House Ways and Means Committee by the end of the most recent legislative session this past summer, we absolutely cannot assume it to be safely "dead"! There is always the possibility that this piece of legislation could resurface next year and wind-up becoming law, even in a modified version. (The bill contains 23 sections in its original form.) Interested A.S.C. members will want to monitor the status of H.4102; the potential restrictions that could be imposed on law-abiding gun owners are numerous and far-reaching. We'll need to inform our legislators that we do not wish this bill to be enacted, even if it becomes "disguised" under a new number and refiled!
